Medical Abbreviation Flashcards

- These flashcards have both the abbreviation and the definition on the same side of the card, separated by a vertical line.

- This format reduces the number of cards and allows the student to cover up either the left or right side of the card to practice recall of either abbreviation or definition.

- Some cards have multiple, related abbreviations, to help the student more easily learn and compare.

- Be careful to use capital or lower case letters where indicated in the abbreviation.

- PRINTOUT slides 4 or 6 per page to make handy, portable flashcards, or just view slides on your device.
